#### **How to Use Google Docs for Writing HW: Grade Faster, Give Better Feedback, and Minimize AI Cheating** **Alexandros M. Goudas**

- J134 *Google Docs is common for teachers to use for written assignments, but it provides little-known tools that can make student work higher quality, grading more efficient, feedback better and faster, and the risk of AI-cheating lower. If you want to make your teaching more effective and efficient, bring your laptop (with a Google account ready) to learn step-by-step how to use these tools and redesign your writing assignments and grading. With this interactive presentation, you will learn how to get students to set up, share, and use their docs, as well as how to create assignments that are currently AI-proof.*

#### **Less Grading, More Learning | Beth Kelch and Brian Aldrich**

- J135 *In this session participants will transform quizzes, assignments, and worksheets into learning experiences for students. These adjustments require little preparation and no grading but provide instructors and students with valuable feedback about their learning. Both face-to-face and online activities will be explored and discussed.*

#### **Building Belonging from Day One | Betheen Gladly-Teschendorf**

- J136 *Belonging is the emotional response felt when inclusion is working, the welcome is sincere, the integration of all parties into the group is successful, and all voices are heard and valued. As you might guess, belonging is also a crucial part of retaining our students. Additionally, it is the key that unlocks deep learning, since the barriers of anxiety and imposter syndrome—distractions that impede focus and productivity—dissolve when belonging takes root. At this session, hear simple ways to create belonging in your classroom starting on the first day and growing throughout the semester.*

#### **Civic Engagement | Kathie Marchlewski, Lisa Lawrason, and Kim Klein**

- J137 *In this session, we will be introducing an exciting new campus-wide initiative: the Civic Immersion (CI) project. This effort is designed to ensure that all Delta College students have meaningful opportunities to engage in civil dialogue and civic life during their time here. A key component of the CI project involves expanding options for students to earn civic engagement credit. Our goal is to support faculty in incorporating civic opportunities across disciplines, through discussion and class projects. This session will provide space for faculty to share ideas and gather inspiration for embedding civic learning in their courses. We'll also be sharing details about a special opportunity for students to celebrate Constitution Day at the Michigan State Capitol this September and learn about an opportunity for students to engage in a conversation about the founding of the United States Constitution. We're excited to collaborate with you as we work to build a more civically engaged campus community.*

### **A Little Flexibility Goes a Long Way | Donna Giuliani**

Donna Giuliani, a Professor of Sociology, assigned countless incompletes to her students throughout more than 20 years of teaching at Delta. Few of those students successfully improved their grade situation. Last year, however, she implemented a Flexible End Date Policy, and the number of students earning a passing grade increased by approximately 4%. Perhaps you are curious to find out how she did it.

### **Mindset Matters | Karry Kiste-Toner**

Karry Kiste-Toner is a licensed professional counselor and serves as Delta's Dean of Student Success. This talk will explore how simple mindset shifts and brief wellness practices can create meaningful change in how we show up for ourselves and others. She will share small, teachable strategies that can support emotional regulation, resilience, and confidence which are easy to integrate into your daily life and student interactions.
