J137 12:00-12:45pm	Accessibility with Ease: free AI Tools from auto-captioning to visual assistants <i>Andrea Bair, Jonathan Gittins and Danielle Petersen</i>	<p><i>This session demonstrates some of the many free AI-supported tools that support accessibility and provide opportunities to share and try out tools on your own computer. Auto-captioning for both live and recorded audio/video is a powerful tool for engagement that benefits everyone. Research shows that 98% of students find captions helpful for learning, supporting students who are hard of hearing, neurodivergent, and those with auditory processing disorders alike. We'll demonstrate how to implement live auto-captioning in PowerPoint, Google Slides, and Zoom, alongside efficient workflows for captioning recorded videos via YouTube and Yuja. We will also explore how Artificial Intelligence can bridge accessibility gaps without increasing your workload. Discover how to use AI to generate descriptive alt text for complex images and leverage transformative smartphone tools like Be My Eyes and Seeing AI for real-time visual assistance. From instant transcripts to AI-driven inclusive design, join us to discover how simple, free resources can transform your digital materials into empowering, accessible environments for every learner.</i></p>

Participants will discuss reasonable accommodations vs. fundamental alterations of a course, protected leave, unique circumstances, the role of the Equity Office and faculty discretion.</i></p>

While Gen Z brings fresh perspectives, digital fluency, and a desire for meaningful work, employers also report gaps in communication, resilience, initiative, and other essential “durable skills” that make-or-break career success.</i></p> <p><i>This workshop bridges that gap. Designed for college faculty and staff, this session explores both sides of the conversation: what hiring managers say they need, and how Gen Z views work, career growth, and professional identity. The session emphasizes the role of the Dual Enrollment Office as the primary point of contact for all dual-related matters, including enrollment, technology access, high school coordination, compliance, and parent or counselor communication. Through interactive discussion, real-world scenarios, and practical tools, faculty will learn how to effectively support dual enrollment students while maintaining academic rigor, FERPA compliance, and consistent institutional practices. We will review faculty strategies that complement Dual Enrollment Office services when faculty should reach out to the dual enrollment office, when students should be referred to the dual enrollment office, Dual Enrollment Office to ensure compliance, consistent communication, and effective student support.
